These high-end ChordMusic cables use Taylon – a proprietary, phase-stable dielectric material, formerly used in military and high-frequency applications. The use of the material as a dielectric was something of a revelation for Chord Company, and many of its subsequent developments owe much to the ChordMusic research.

On test, we said: “ChordMusic has a natural quality of vocal texture and instrumental timbre that can be beguiling.”

Signature Super ARAY USB Cable



Signature Super ARAY USB, the follow-up to the successful Signature Tuned ARAY from the mid-2010s, has had electromechanical tuning applied to the cable to enhance signal propagation.

In our review, we said: “Signature Super Aray is a USB cable in fine balance. It does all of the things you want of a good cable and none of the things you don't.”

PowerHaus P6 Mains Distribution Board



As its name suggests, the PowerHaus P6 mains distribution board has six sockets, which should be sufficient for most high-grade hi-fi systems. However, don't be confused by its somewhat utilitarian appearance; PowerHaus by name, power house by nature!

Our reviewer said: “With the P6 in my system, the bass parts were palpably better articulated than with a standard board. With the latter, they seemed more overblown and congested.”

PhonoArray Turntable Grounding



Cynics initially dismissed the PhonoArray because turntables have a grounding wire as standard. Then they heard what it's capable of! The PhonoArray is a surprisingly weighty CNCd aluminium cylinder, 10cm long and five in diameter, with a single banana/ inch speaker-type terminal at each end.

In our recent test, we said: “Sound-staging sounded more crisply defined and less blurred.”
